INSTRUCTIONS FOR PATIENTS FOR STOOL COLLECTIONS

- 1. Follow the instructions for the different vials depending on the stool test your doctor has ordered.
- 2. If the vial contains liquid **DO NOT DISCARD IT**, add stool carefully up to the indicator line. The liquids in the vials are **POISONOUS!**Keep out of reach of children.
- 3. Do not collect the stool from the toilet, no urine or water can come in contact with the stool.
- 4. Do not overfill the vials.
- 5. Screw lids onto the vials tightly.
- 6. Label all containers with the patient name, birth date, date and time of collection and the stool consistency (Examples: watery, loose, soft, firm) on the container.
- 7. Take the vials to the nearest Sanford facility. Please call the Sanford Laboratory if you have any questions: 701-323-5439.
