

Pathology Services

Complete anatomic pathology services are available, including routine surgical pathology, frozen sections, special stains and immunohistochemistry.

Surgical pathology

Surgical specimens are received in 10 percent neutral buffered formalin by 4 p.m. for overnight processing and next day reporting. The tissue is sectioned and reported by the pathologist on a daily weekday basis. Frozen sections are available in the clinic and hospital from 8 a.m.—5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Frozen sections not within working hours should be scheduled with the pathologist on call, if possible.

Emergency frozen sections or operating room consults are available on a 24 hour, seven day a week basis and should be arranged with the pathologist on call.

Special procedures

Please schedule at least 24 hours in advance:

- Renal biopsies: The pathologist will be available to evaluate adequacy of specimen. Special fixatives and handling are required.
- Muscle/nerve biopsies: Special fixatives and handling are required.
- Cilia biopsies: Special fixatives and handling are required.

Other unusual specimens or requests for surgical pathology should be coordinated with the histology department or a pathologist.

Specimen reports for routine cases are sent by computer within two working days, unless additional studies are needed. Telephone reports by a pathologist for both in-house and out-of-town specimens are made on request.
